First meeting

The plan will be along the lines of those that Odisha and Gujarat already have in place. The instructions were issued to draft a comprehensive action plan on heat wave as per GO MS No.3. The committee is expected to have its first meeting after August 24.

A senior officer from the department of disaster management said, "The meeting will be held before the coming legislative assembly session. After the meeting, experts from institutions including Environment Protection Training and Research Institute (EPTRI) will be consulted."

As on June this year 511 people in the State, succumbed to heat wave related illnesses. Nalgonda and Khammam districts were the worst hit in Telangana, officials However, the numbers were higher in Andhra Pradesh with over 1,300 people succumbing to the heat wave by June.

"Last year the government

took precautionary measures during summer. As deaths were reported despite awareness and welfare programmes the State has decided to come up with an action plan on tackling heat wave," said B R Meena, principal secretary, Revenue who is heading the committee.

An army against agri pest attack

Bengaluru-based NBAIR has several weapons up its sleeve

BENGALURU: A strange white substance on a few rambutan fruits puzzled the officials at the quarantine cell in the Kempegowda International Airport. They immediately sent a batch to the National Bureau of Agricultural Insect Resources (NBAIR) for it to be tested.

The entomologists at NBAIR identified the white substance as the Sapota mealybug, a pest that had seriously affected crops in the Philippines. As suggested by them, the quarantine cell officials destroyed the entire consignment of the rambutan

"This timely detection helped save loss amounting to crores. The mealybug never established itself here, as we nipped it in the bud," noted Abraham Verghese, director of NBAIR.

The mandate of the citybased NBAIR is to ensure that no insects or pests affect agri-

vigil. Currently, the entomologists are working towards mitigating the threat posed by the cassava mealybug and the coconut hispine beetle. While the cassava mealybug is a major threat to tapioca plantations in Africa, especially East Africa, the coconut hispine beetle has affected coconut plantations in neighbouring Myanmar and many Southeast Asian countries.

"We frequently take out expeditions, while our own facilities in Assam, Mizoram, Arunachal Pradesh and many other States are on the vigil for these insects. culture and is on constant instance, NBAIR used entomopathogenic nematode to kill the root grub of white grub that had affected cash crops, sugarcane, groundnut and maize. "The tiny wormlike insect affected the root grubs and multiplied within it. We developed a talc-like substance with the inactive nematode. The nematodes get activated when applied to the affected field with a little moisture. We have Intellectual Property Rights over the product," he said. Similarly, NBAIR has also developed traps for the tomato pest -Tuta absoluta.

HYDERABAD: The Telangana government has given 100 hand-held cameras to the Hyderabad traffic police. These cameras be used to record traffic policemen's interaction with the public. The officials are hopeful that this move, the first in the country, would not only curb corruption but also enhance the department's image.

At the launch event, Hyderabad Police Commissioner Mahender Reddy said the cameras would also help nail those citizens who are on the wrong side of the law but complain of police high hand-

Vizhinjam plan: **Chandy consults** church officials

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: Kerala Minister Oommen Chandy on Saturday held discussions with representatives of the Latin Catholic church in an effort to assuage their apprehensions over the Vizhinjam project.

The meeting was held at the Minister's residence Chief

A Church spokesperson later said that Chandy had given them a patient hearing and they were expecting a 'favourable' response from government.

The Latin church had stated that nearly 50,000 fishermen would have to be rehabilitated due to the project and would lose their livelihood once it becomes a reality.

The church wants the government to address the concerns of the fishermen community and has also threatened to launch an indefinite agitation from August 17, when the government will be signing an MoU with Adani Vizhinjam Ports Ltd, the SPV floated by Adani Ports and Spe-

cial Economic Zone Ltd. The fishermen have demanded a better rehabilitation package for those getting affected by the deep water sea-

BENGALURU: Newly released images of the Martian surface taken by the Indian Mars orbiter show Ophir Chasma, a canyon 317 km long to the south of the Martian equator.

The 'chasma' is part of Valles Marineris, which scientists say is the largest canvon system in the entire solar system.

A 'chasma' is a long, steepsided depression as designated by the International Astronomical Union.

The three-dimensional images of the terrain of interest were taken by the Mars Colour Camera on July 19 from a

distance of 1,857 km and with released earlier. a resolution of 96 metres, the Indian Space Research Organisation said on Saturday. "The walls of the chasma contain many layers and the floors contain large deposits of layered materials," it said.

Ophir Chasma

The Ophir Chasma lies in the Coprates square (quadrangle) and is named after Mars enthusiast Ophir Bentov of Los Angeles, who has invested in Mars expeditions eventual human exploration.

The first Indian Mars Orbiter Mission, costing around Rs. 450 crore, has been going round the red planet since September 2014 and has exceeded the planned life of six

The camera is one of the five scientific instruments it carries as it orbits Mars in an elliptical path of 470 km by 71,000 km once in about three Earth days.

Tiruchi airport gets e-tourist visa system

TIRUCHI: The Tiruchi International Airport on Saturday became one of the gateways for foreign tourists entering the country with e-tourist visas, an online visa issue system introduced by the Union government.

Tiruchi is now one of the 16 designated airports in the country, which have been approved as entry points for foreigners arriving in the country with e-tourist visas. While nine airports, including Chennai, were already ap-

Tourists from 113 countries, including Australia, Brazil, Canada, France, Georgia, Germany, Indonesia, Israel, Japan, Mauritius, Mexico, New Zealand, Philippines, Russia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Malaysia, Spain, Portu-Seychelles, Netherlands, Sweden and United Kingdom, could use

the e-tourist visa facility. Under the system, foreign

through www.indianvisaonline.gov.in minimum four days in advance of their arrival. They can pay the fee online and would be required to arrive at the designated airports with a print out of the e-TV (tourist visa) generated online. The visas would have a validity of 30 days from the date of arrival Biometric details of the applicant will be mandatorily captured on arrival in India. The facility can be availed for a maximum of two visits to the country in a calendar year.
